
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

# Pashmina: Unravelling the Rich Heritage and Craftsmanship of Kashmiri Elegance

Pashmina, often hailed as 'soft gold,' finds its origin in the Changthang plateau of Ladakh, nestled high in the Himalayas. Sourced from the undercoat of the Himalayan Mountain goat, scientifically known as Capra hircus, Pashmina wool develops in response to the harsh winters, providing the goats with insulation and protection.

Hand-processed with care, the soft and fine wool is meticulously gathered and skilfully woven by master artisans to craft luxurious shawls and scarves. Renowned for its distinct warmth and lightweight nature, Pashmina stands as a coveted choice for those seeking both comfort and elegance."

Pashm, originating from Persian, signifies wool, yet in the context of Kashmir, it denotes the unspun wool of Changthangi goats. In contemporary language, 'pashmina' can refer to both the raw material and the distinctive Kashmir shawl crafted from it.

#### **History**

Wool fibres discovered in ancient Harappa artifacts date back to the Indus Valley Civilization, resembling Pashmina and Shahtoosh. Pashmina gained prominence through its use in Kashmir shawls, becoming a symbol of rank in Mughal times. Babur, founder of the Mughal Empire, initiated the tradition of gifting khalat, including Pashmina garments, as a mark of honour. Akbar, Babur's grandson, continued this practice after conquering Kashmir in 1568. Pashmina shawls were integral to khil'at ceremonies during Akbar's reign.

From the 16th to the early 20th centuries, Iranian emperors also adorned themselves with Pashmina, exchanging Kashmir shawls within political and religious practices. In India, Pakistan, and Nepal, Pashmina blankets were prized additions to wealthy women's dowries. Despite being worn by men, Kashmiri shawls in 19th-century English writing became synonymous with women's luxuries, serving as heirlooms and symbols of marital status. In France, the Pashmina Kashmir shawl became a fashion icon through Empress Joséphine de Beauharnais, adding warmth and visual interest to French gowns.

#### **Production**

Pashmina wool, prized for its softness and warmth, comes from goats that naturally shed their winter coat every spring, yielding approximately 80-170 grams of fiber per goat. Unlike other fine wools, Pashmina is collected through combing, not shearing, during the moulting season. The Changpa people of Ladakh, Himalayas, particularly in the Changthang plateau, rear Pashmina goats in the extreme conditions of Tibet, where temperatures can drop to -40°C.

The Changpa, a nomadic community, not only rear sheep for meat but also Pashmina goats for their wool. The raw Pashmina is then exported to Kashmir, where the entire production process, from combing to spinning, weaving, and finishing, is meticulously carried out by hand by skilled craftsmen. The primary hub for Pashmina fabric production is the historic district of Srinagar. The creation of a single traditional Pashmina stole (70x200cm) demands about 180 hours of manual labour, reflecting the intricate craftsmanship involved in producing this luxurious textile.


